An Update from YOUR Executive Committee The Executive Committee met on Friday (22/11/24) to discuss important issues like changes to our representation structure, the University's financial status, and UCU's response to staff redundancy proposals. The Committee, made up of elected officers and the Union Leadership Team, defends members' rights. Our Vision is for every student to thrive at Brunel, guided by our core value of Integrity. As fee-paying members, you deserve to know what's happening.

Current Financial Challenges

Brunel, like many UK universities, faces financial difficulties, leading to significant staff reductions. While necessary, we are concerned about the impact on students. Our aim is to minimize this impact. This is a UK-wide issue, not just at Brunel. As elected

representatives, we are committed to supporting both students and staff.

We've met with UCU and understand their concerns. Redundancies are planned for March 2025, affecting students during a crucial academic period. Students and their representatives have been excluded from discussions, leading to decisions without student input. Students pay for a service and experience at Brunel, and their voices should be included in all plans.

We believe students and staff must be prioritized.
We expect the University to explore all cost-saving options before cutting staff jobs.
The Union is independent of the University, affiliated with the National Union of Students, and represents students' best interests. We are here to make your voices heard. Let's work together to minimize the impact. Reconsider Timeframe

An urgent reconsideration of the planed timeframes to ensure that students are not impacted at an integral time of their studies. Delay academic redundancies until June or July 2025.

✓ Increased Transparency

Clear details on how the £40 millions required savings was calculated, with full transparency about the current financial situation and the 'banking covenant' that has put the university into this financial situation.

Increased Communication

More student focused communication outlining what the challenges of the changes will be for students and how the leadership plans of minimising the short-term impact of these changes.

More Clarification

A detailed plan with comprehensive rational explaining how the redundanies and centralisation will answer the University's current challenges and benefits students.
